

ROADS (WORKS, USE AND COMPENSATION) ORDINANCE (Chapter 370)

(Notice under section 8(2))

 SITE FORMATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE WORKS FOR PUBLIC
 HOUSING DEVELOPMENT AT KA WAI MAN ROAD AND
 EX-MOUNT DAVIS COTTAGE AREA, KENNEDY TOWN

Notice is hereby given that under powers delegated by the Secretary for Transport and Housing under section 3(3) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370), the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) proposes to execute the road works within the limit of works area as shown on Plan No. 188843/B&V/GZ/001 ('the Plan') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, which the Plan and scheme have been deposited in the Land Registry.

The general nature of the proposed works is as follows:—

- (i) widening and modification of a section of carriageway at Victoria Road;
- (ii) construction of a vehicular access connecting the proposed public housing development to Victoria Road;
- (iii) construction of a covered footbridge and two lift towers with associated staircases and lifts connecting the proposed public housing development and Ka Wai Man Road to Victoria Road;
- (iv) construction of footpath and bus lay-by;
- (v) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing carriageways into footpath and central reserve/refuge island;
- (vi) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing footpaths into carriageways and central reserve/refuge island;
- (vii) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing tracks into carriageways, lift tower with associated staircase and lift, footpaths and amenity areas;
- (viii) temporary closure and reconstruction of sections of the existing carriageway, footpaths and track;
- (ix) temporary closure of sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths, tracks and open places;
- (x) demolition and conversion of sections of the existing slopes into lift tower with associated staircase and lifts, carriageways, footpaths, track, central reserves/refuge islands, amenity areas and footbridge column; and
- (xi) ancillary works including reconstruction of slope and construction of retaining walls, as well as geotechnical, electrical and mechanical, landscaping, traffic lighting, drainage, sewerage, water and utilities works.

The Plan and scheme may be inspected by members of the public free of charge at the following places and during the following hours when those offices are normally open to the public:—

Any person who wishes to object to the works or the use, or both, is required to address to the Secretary for Transport and Housing an objection in writing, which can be submitted *via* one of the following means:—

The objector should describe his interest and the manner in which he alleges that he will be affected by the works or the use in his notice of objection. Objectors are requested to provide contact details to facilitate communication. A notice of objection should be delivered to the Secretary for Transport and Housing not later than 21st day of August 2018.

Personal Information Collection Statement

Any information, including the personal data, submitted to the Secretary for Transport and Housing in connection with any written objections/comments will be used for the processing of the objections/comments and other related purposes. The provision of any information, including the personal data, other than the information as required under section 10(2) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) is voluntary. However, it may not be possible to process the objections/comments if such information, including the personal data, is not sufficiently provided. Any information, including the personal data, so submitted may be disclosed to the relevant government departments and other persons, organizations or agencies which are required to handle the objections/comments and related matters. Persons who have so submitted their personal data have the rights to request access to and correction of their personal data held by us.
